On Wednesday 6th December, several staff from Howmet Aerospace came into the school to do a workshop with some of our Year 7 pupils. This is one



of several of the school's initiatives to get pupils thinking about what they'd like to do in the future as a career. Howmet Aerospace is a local engineering company that has over eighty years of history in the manufacture of parts used in the aircraft industry. Pupils got to find out



what is involved in the manufacturing process including how

robotics is used, which particularly interested them. Howmet creates amongst other things, a wide range of

fasteners used in aircraft, and pupils were astonished to learn that over a million of these are used in an average plane. In the Spring term the same group of pupils will visit their factory in Redditch to take a first-hand look at what the manufacturing process involves. Howmet is a company that employs a number of apprentices. An apprenticeship is a paid job where the employee learns and gains valuable experiences of that particular trade. Alongside on-the-job training, apprentices spend at least 20% of their working hours completing classroom-based learning with a college, university or



training provider which leads to a nationally recognised qualification. Many apprentices end up getting a job with the employer they did their apprenticeship with, and this is certainly true with Howmet. Apprenticeships are a valuable and popular route into employment and later in the school year we will have a representative from Worcestershire Apprenticeships come in to explain to our Key Stage 3 pupils exactly what they involve. If you'd like to find out more information about apprenticeships and careers you can find information and links on our school website. The workshop ended with a very intense but enjoyable jigsaw challenge. Unfortunately I am sworn to secrecy about which team came out the winners!











Year 5



Cyberfirst Girls

In November, four year 8 girls took part in the National Cyber Security Centre's competition, CyberFirst Girls. The CyberFirst Girls Competition aims to inspire girls interested in technology to pursue a career in cyber security. At present, women make up only 17% of the UK cyber workforce. This contest is designed to help address the lack of diversity and encourage girls to explore the world of cyber and technology. The competition, which was a team event, saw the "Woodfield 1 Wonders" tackle challenges from cryptography and logic to artificial intelligence and networking.

After a week of completing challenges and much hard work, the team amassed 5168 points, with cryptography being their most successful subject. Some challenges pushed the girls to think even deeper and addressed many high-level topics (some of which even made Mr Smith cry!).

This year saw the biggest uptake of competitors, with over 12,500 girls taking part nationwide across 750 schools. The "Woodfield 1 Wonders" placed 2nd in the West Midlands region, and 95th in the country- meaning that the four girls placed in the top 12% of the country.

The girls have performed admirably, and we want to congratulate Darcey, Aishah, Anya, and Hafsah, for their effort and achievement. They are a great representation of our #OneWoodfield values.

Free School Meals

You may be eligible for free school meals if your child attends a state school, and you must be receiving one or more of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Support under part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act, 1999
- Child Tax Credit, and your annual income is less than £16,190
- **Guaranteed Pension Credit**
- **Income-based Employment and Support** Allowance
- Working Tax Credit run-on
- Universal Credit, and your annual household income is £7,400 per annum (£616 per month) or less after tax, and not including any benefits.
